A Great Summer for All

This summer, First Baptist will have a special treat. Dr. Bob Wallace who served as our Senior Pastor from 1973 to 1983 is going to return to serve with Pastor Erin Goddard on our pastoral staff. I am excited about the leadership he will share in our worship services during the summer and the guidance he will provide the staff during these months.

The occasion for Bob returning in this role is the sabbatical that I will be taking this summer. Every seven years the pastors of First Baptist are encouraged to take a sabbatical in order to pursue enriching interests that will empower them in their discipleship and church leadership. As many of you know, I have taken the opportunity to travel during my sabbaticals, seeking to learn more about the world and the people who inhabit this planet with us.

This sabbatical, Cindy, Christina, and I will be traveling to China and India. One third of the world's population lives in these two countries, and I want to learn and experience more of how two billion people live. Also, India is the home of many of the world's great religions, and I would enjoy learning more about how these great religions shape the lives of people in this country. Technically, one could chalk up my interests as theological anthropology which is the branch of theology that studies humankind in relation to the divine.

I believe that as we learn more about others, we discover more about ourselves. Considering the distinctiveness of others helps us perceive and understand better our distinctiveness. Appreciating how other people's lives are shaped by their faith helps us see more clearly how our faith is shaping our lives. There are many different ways to be "human." I believe our full humanity is discovered in Jesus. I believe that the more we learn about our humanity, the greater our appreciation will be of who we are becoming in Jesus. Experiencing the common humanity we share with others and the distinctiveness of our own humanity helps us grow, I believe, in our appreciation of God's grace and goodness.

I hope you will be in prayer for Cindy, Christina, and me, as we prepare for our journey and travel this summer—that we will experience the grace and goodness of God as we explore the different ways of being "human." I will be keeping you in my thoughts and prayers as you are blessed with outstanding leadership this sabbatical season. We will be overseas for five weeks and then traveling a couple of weeks in the states. I will then be engaged in a period of study and growth for the rest of the sabbatical period. My sabbatical will begin on June 14. I will return to my pastoral duties on September 7. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to ask. I look forward to sharing my journey with you in the fall and hearing about all the good things that happened during the summer months in and through the ministry of our church.

I do not take lightly the opportunity the church gives me to explore and to grow—not simply through times of sabbatical, but on a weekly basis as I prepare for preaching and teaching. My hope is that as a congregation we will continually be exploring opportunities to help one another grow in faith as disciples of Jesus. My commitment has been to help develop educational programs for the whole family and people of all ages to explore and experience the grace and goodness of God. Our Mission Statement states that we believe "we are called to sharpen our minds, widen our hearts, and deepen our spirits as we grow and serve together." Please contact me if I can be of greater help in this area. My desire is for everyone to have all they need to take that next step in the journey of faith, following Jesus whose love affirms and fulfills our full humanity to the glory of God.

The Most Honest Expression of My Soul that I Can Muster

If I am being honest, I have to admit that I really do not particularly care for praying, at least not in the way we generally talk about it. I understand the great value in spoken and written prayer, and have had the privilege of knowing many people for whom the linguistic prayer (both creating and experiencing) comes easily, potently, and meaningfully. But for myself in my own life, I have had to work at it. Because of the profession I have chosen, I do a lot of praying out loud. It's a good discipline for me precisely because I do not always enjoy doing it, and have trouble finding the words that give meaning to what I feel.

But it also means that I have spent a fair bit of time searching out other methods to accomplish that goal. After college I found the textile arts, which, I admit, seem to be a far cry from pious and earnest soul-manifesting that prayer hopes to achieve. But almost immediately, the work of weaving melted away all barriers to God that had been in place for me. The following is a reflection about why weaving is, for me, the most honest expression of my soul that I can muster. I suspect that there are others out there who cannot ever seem to find the right words and long for something else to make that connection that prayer hopes to build. There are millions of ways to know and communicate with God. This is one of mine.

There is a smell that makes my heart stop momentarily. It is the smell of lambs and green herbs and boiling water, and is so familiar to me that I have cried in its presence when it came upon me unexpectedly. It is a smell that reminds me of comfort, security, and unwavering compassion. For reasons I do not fully understand, this is the smell that I associate with weaving.

I weave because it reassures me that I am living in both the beloved community and the realized kingdom of God. I cannot, through my weaving, halt the cycles of addiction or poverty, or any other ill in this world. In fact, there is little practical use for my work; the industrial revolution rendered my efforts useless before they even started. There is no way to bring the community of God that is and the one that hopes to be into accord through weaving.

All that I can do (and what I am compelled to do) is remember that when I sit at my loom and begin pulling those spun fibers across the beams, the mysterious scent of the weaving threads will return from an unknown source and reassure me that my hopes are not lost. The sheets of fabric that emerge from that loom send up the knowledge that work for love and for good is slow and precarious. But the long warp threads keep coming up from the hidden underside of the loom, reassuring me of the continuum of grace there, allowing new beginnings at every turn of the crank.

Worldwide: Earthquake victims

Please continue to pray for the victims of the recent earthquakes in Haiti, Chile, Turkey, Mexico, and now China. The April 4 quake centered near Mexicali caused only a few fatalities, but damaged property and disrupted many people's lives and businesses.

The magnitude 6.9 quake on April 14 in the central-western province of Qinghai, China, left hundreds dead and thousands injured, with cold weather and high altitude slowing the arrival and efforts of relief workers.

Pray for those who are left homeless to find shelter from the elements and have access to clean

water and sanitation. Pray for businesses to re-open so people can get back to work. Pray for people to have peace so that they are not afraid of aftershocks and can sleep at night.

Junior Disciples (JD) will begin Sunday, June 20th with the awarding of Bibles to 2nd graders, giving them their t-shirts and "promoting" them to Junior Disciples. Every Sunday during the summer, the JDs will begin in the church service. Just before the sermon, they will be dismissed to the lounge where guest speakers will spend time with them, telling their story about a specific discipline of following Jesus. The eleven discipleship topics they will learn are: Bibles, Greeting/Welcoming Others, Ushering/Offering, Prayer, Worship/Music, Communion, Baptism, Local Missions Work, Foreign Missions work, Acolytes, and ending with their traditional reception after the service with the topic of Fellowship/Hospitality. many years without incident. "What changed?" asked one confused man, who had been working for an orphanage called Village of Hope. The government authorities simply informed those involved that they had to leave the country in a matter of hours. One man didn't even get to go home and say goodbye to his wife.

While the government claims it is not involved on a crackdown on Christians, several of those interviewed by World Magazine worry that "the heat is on Moroccan Christians." Please pray for this situation in Morocco. Pray for all Christians there—both foreigners and native Moroccans—to be free to worship without government intrusion. Pray for the gospel to continue to go forward in word and deed, despite government pressure.

Poland
Christianity Today

You may have read about the plane crash in April that killed 95, including Poland's president and many government leaders. However, several high-profile religious leaders also were lost. Adam Pilch was a Lutheran bishop and military chaplain. The ceremony to which they were headed, marking the 70th anniversary of the massacre of Poles at Katyn by the Soviets, was to be the chaplain's last official act. Orthodox archbishop Miron Chodakowski and Catholic bishop Tadeusz Ploski were senior military chaplains as well. Other key priests were also on board.

Pray for the people of Poland as they mourn the loss of so many leaders in so many different areas. Pray for new leadership to fill the spaces left behind.

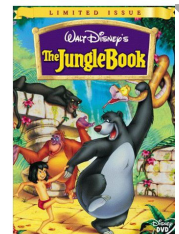

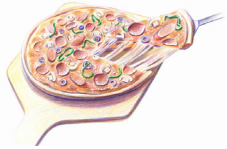

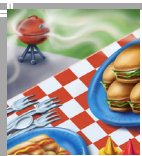
